The purpose of this presentation is to demonstrate a multi-method approach for teaching business ethics that is centered on an in-class role playing exercise and to engage faculty in a discussion of the theoretical motivation for this approach and its pros and cons.

The role playing exercise is based upon the belief that that in order to raise students' consciousness about ethical issues, students must be challenged to experience conscious ethical conflicts and to incorporate their own values into solving ethical problems.

A key component of this process is for students to consider the positions of the stakeholders prior to the decision and the potential impact that the outcomes of the decision will have on each of the stakeholders
